

## *Souvenir of Vincennes, Indiana*

1779



1929

George Rogers Clark captured Fort Sackville at Vincennes on February 25, 1779. The United States Post Office Department issued a 2¢ bi-colored stamp on February 25, 1929 to commemorate the 150th anniversary. The central design showing Lt. Governor Hamilton formally surrendering to General Clark is from a painting by Frederic C. Yohn. The painting is owned by the Indiana Historical Society.

1950

The Congressional Act establishing Indiana Territory was effective July 4, 1800. The United States Post Office Department issued a 3¢ stamp on July 4, 1950 to commemorate the 150th anniversary. The portrait is of William Henry Harrison, the first governor of the Indiana Territory and the ninth president of the United States. On the right is the Territorial Hall, the first capitol and at one time, the seat of government for most of the Mississippi River valley.
